## Pastoral Ponderings

For 6 weeks, the Poor People's Campaign staged actions in Albany and many other state capitals across the nation. For three of those weeks, they gathered at Emmanuel for a couple of hours of instruction and inspiration and interaction before heading out for the day's demonstration. They came on buses from Syracuse and New York City and by

other modes of transportation from all over the area. Every week, there was a faithful crew of volunteers who showed up hours ahead of time to make sandwiches and set out lunch and another crew who helped re-arrange our sanctuary, carefully filling the space with plastic chairs and tables. Some Emmanuelites were among the volunteers each week, but they were joined by others from across the capital district. The sustained energy and commitment contributed to this endeavor, often by people who had no previous connection to each other, was something to see.


On the last week that Emmanuel hosted, I took the stage for a few minutes to make a logistical announcement. I simply wanted to invite individuals to move their chairs to a certain location, to make it easier for the take-down crew to re-set the sanctuary. When the crowd of about 200 people understood that I was Emmanuel's pastor, they applauded in gratitude for our support. And then, as I moved among the people who were complying with my directions about the chairs, several individuals made a point to find me and offer a sincere thank you for sharing our space. It was my pleasure to receive all those thank you's, but you should know that they were expressed.

I am grateful for Emmanuel's concern for social justice, with support for the Poor People's Campaign being just one expression of that concern. Another expression is found in how some of us choose to spend summer vacation. While Nancy, Andrea, Edith, Marilyn, Jim and Jan are returning from the summer conference of the Baptist Peace Fellowship, Jim and I will be packing up for the Wild Goose Festival. I mentioned the Goose in a sermon recently and a few of you expressed further interest. The Goose describes itself as "an art, music and story-driven transformational experience groundedin faith-inspired social justice." Across four days, there are performances, lectures, interviews and interactive workshops. I count 278 separate activities on the schedule. Opportunities range from yoga to AA meetings to contemplative prayer at various hours to the ever popular Beer and Hymns (and a workshop on organizing your own Beer and Hymns chapter). My attention was caught by these titles, *Love in a Dangerous Time*, *Disruptive Worship: Liturgy for Justice*, *The Bible for Normal People*, *Immigration Dete* what that is, because it starts at 11 p.m., past my bedtime. If you're thinking this sounds like a church nerd's dream, you are right. Thank you for your generosity in providing time away to rest and recharge. I hope we all find our own opportunities to do that this summer.

Our insurance company has sent us a settlement, but there are several choices still before us such as replacing a steam heat system, switching to hot water heat, radiant heat, installing a hot air system, and/or air conditioning. Corporate Management will seek your approval for expending funds for this project.

Congratulations to Mushal Johnson who received a B.A. degree from SUNY Albany!


#### **Johnson Din Completes Doctorate**
