

Pastoral Ponderings



I wonder how we will remember 2019? It might be the *Year of Great Experiments*. It might be *Let's Never Try That Again Year*. Maybe we'll call it *No Pain, No Gain* or *You Win Some, You Lose Some*. All right, I will stop with the clichés now. Standing on the threshold of a bright shiny new year is always an experiment, always a wondering about what the next circuit around the sun will hold. This year is

just like that, but also different. This year we are intentionally changing some rules, setting up some new expectations, experimenting with the ways we have come to order ourselves as a congregation.

When I first arrived here, you told me two dominant truths about yourselves. You told me that you were creative risk-takers – that was what I heard every time you told the story about removing the pews from the sanctuary. And you told me that you had left behind a church model where the pastor was the CEO of the congregation and the church members rubber-stamped his (or her, but really mostly his) directions. You said you wanted to do ministry yourselves, in partnership with a pastor who would help to lead, equip and encourage you. I believed you then and I still believe you, which is why I think this year of experiments may be one of our best yet.

The change in our governance structure is something to which EBC was moving before I arrived. For the last 8 years, every Coordinating Council has discussed either rewriting the bylaws or re-imagining the structure in some way. Finally, last year, we suspended our current bylaws so that we could move forward. Our hope is that after a year of living into a new

structure, we will be able to describe it in strong, clear language that will form new by-laws. Our old structure was too large and was not working for us, which is what drove us to seek change. However, the new structure is not intended to be a simplified version of the old.

The goal of the new structure is to enable more people to be more involved in hands-on ministry and less tied-up in business meetings. In the new structure, there are two people elected to each of six ministry areas. Two people alone cannot do the work of any of these ministry areas. It will require all of us, sharing our gifts and creativity and strength of purpose, to accomplish what we discern God calling us to do. Translation – <u>everyone</u> needs to be listening for God's call carefully and stepping up to serve.

A second goal of the new structure is to build in a long-range, forward-looking component to our leadership. This is the major work of the Executive Board. The hope is that new leadership group will work together in a way that is more proactive and less reactive, in a process that allows us to set aside administrative urgencies in order to take time for deeper conversations about our hopes and dreams.

The new governance structure is one big experiment in 2019. A second big experiment is a pastoral renewal leave. To my knowledge, none of Emmanuel's previous pastors have had the opportunity for a paid sabbatical leave. I am grateful and intend to make good use of the time. I will share more detailed information about my plans in a future newsletter. For now, let me simply say that I will be gone from May 6 through August 25. A Sabbatical Committee is working even now on pastoral supply and policies during my absence. Please offer your comments or concerns to one of them: Mark Chaffin, Judy Henningson, Curtis Klope, Edith Leet, or Tony Malone. They meet again on January 14.



That will be part of the fun. May we begin 2019 together united in trust and hope, looking forward to the great experiments we will perform together.

The theme of *justice* comes from Deuteronomy 16:18-20, which directs the Hebrew people to "...judge the people fairly...not pervert justice (or) accept bribes... and follow justice and justice alone, so that you may live and possess the land the Lord your God is giving you." • The word *justice* itself does not appear in the New Testament, but the concept is foundational to Jesus' teachings.
