Pastoral Ponderings

In this Lenten season, we have practiced deep listening, because we are formed by what we attend to. Listening to God, listening to our own internal voice, listening to what emerges from the silence that we must cultivate in our noisy world, we find spiritual power to shape our lives.

This month, on Easter morning, we will celebrate Resurrection once again. Resurrection is God's emphatic declaration that life wins. Resurrection is God's flesh-and-blood demonstration that love wins. Resurrection is Jesus's triumph over the power of suffering and violence and death. We who follow the Risen One, we who are formed by what we attend to, surely we, of all people, have access to the spiritual power of courage. It seems to me that what the world needs, what we need from ourselves, what God needs, are loving people who are also courageous.

I love this prayer by the Rev. Howard Thurman. It is my prayer for Eastertide and beyond:

Give me the courage to live! Really live- not merely exist.

Live dangerously, Scorning risk! Live honestly. Daring the truthParticularly the truth of myself! Live resilientlyEver changing, ever growing, ever adapting.

Enduring the pain of change as though 'twere the travail of birth.

Give me the courage to live!

Give me the strength to be free and endure the burden of freedom

And the loneliness of those without chains;

Let me not be trapped by success, nor by failure, nor pleasure, nor grief,

Nor malice, nor praise, nor remorse!

Give me the courage to go on!




The 39th Annual Albany CROP Hunger Walk is scheduled for Sunday, May 5th. 25% of all funds raised by the Capita
