#### First Impressions



Greetings, Friends!

As you probably know, it is hard to look at something you're used to with fresh eyes. When Dan and I moved into our house in Albany, I was irritated by a door knob that doesn't match the other door knobs. Now it doesn't really bother me any more. The truth is, I've stopped even seeing it.

The same holds true for the crabapple tree in front of our house. The first spring we were here, I couldn't stop looking at the blooming branches that brushed against our second floor windows. This week, I notice pink petals on the sidewalk under the tree and realized I hadn't even noticed that the tree bloomed.

I am not completely new to Emmanuel Baptist Church, but I'm not totally used to the place either. So I thought I would share a few observations--in case these are things you don't see any more!

- Most people enter the church through the side door. Visitors, however, usually enter the church through the front door. These doors lead to a vestibule at the front of the church which then leads to the sanctuary. There aren't usually people standing near these doors before worship.
- EBC puts kids in the center of the worship space--and the kids are completely comfortable there.
- After worship, people disappear from the sanctuary through a side door. It isn't clear to a visitor where they are going or why.
- There is a cabinet in the sanctuary, towards the front door, filled with interesting old things including a pile of rocks. It seems mysterious.

- Choir members smile when they sing.
- The most energetic part of the worship service is the Doxology.
- The congregation holds the world in prayer--you don't just pray for yourselves.
- The Yahoo Group, "ebc-announce", helps me feel connected to the congregation. Is everyone a part of this list? Does everyone know they could join?

I am glad for the chance to share these observations now because I'm sure by the end of the summer I won't notice any of this anymore!
