Greetings, Friends!

Now that the academic year has ended at Union College where I serve as the Interim Campus Protestant Minister, I've been filling out reports about how many students came to the various programs I offered. For many years, our Tuesday evening "Dinner and Discussion with Diversity" has been a popular event on campus. This year, 27 students joined in as

we talked about "Big Questions" and ate food from a wide variety of Schenectady's ethnic restaurants. But I was surprised to discover that an even larger number--37 students--joined me for "Mindful Monday", a new event this year.

Every Monday during the term, a group of students gathered with me in Union's "Prayer and Meditation Room", a small room in the campus center right next to the dining hall. One of us gave a short introduction to Mindfulness Meditation and then we sat in silence together for 15 minutes, attempting to focus only on our breath and the current moment.

When I arrived on campus last July and told a staff member at the student Wellness Center that I was thinking of starting a Mindfulness group, the person warned me that 15 minutes of silence would be way too long. "You might want to start with 5 minutes," she told me. "Much longer and the students will want to run out of the room." I decided to take a risk and ignore her advice--and only one student ran out of the room all year.

Mindfulness is trendy right now, I guess, but the basic practice has been around forever in various forms. Back in Divinity School I learned a practice called "Centering Prayer" that is a close cousin. The basic idea is to spend a set period of time each day training our brains to slow down and pay attention to whatever is happening right now. It is surprisingly hard to do. Practice for just a few minutes and you'll discover that your mind dwells on the past or imagines the future much more easily than it notices the present. Paying attention to the hear and now takes a lot of practice--and a lot of patience.

When I attended the visioning meeting of the Executive Team last week, I was impressed by how seriously the group was taking the work of imagining what EBC's future might look like. The group had read at least eight books between them and everyone had taken notes and gleaned important ideas. One theme that emerged from all of that research for me was how important it is to pay attention to the place in which a church is located. Who lives there? Who works there? What are they interested in? What are they concerned about? The future of the church, these writers argued, is rooted in the present.

I was struck by the connection between this advice for church and the practice of mindfulness. Just like people, churches spend a lot of time dwelling on the past or

imagining the future. We must somehow find that easier than just being right where we are, as we are, in the place where we are. But maybe, with practice, we can start to take to heart the wisdom of all those books. We just need to breathe in, breathe out, and invite ourselves back into the moment at hand.


