Pastoral Ponderings

I am about to leave for vacation. I don't think I have ever needed a vacation as much as this one. The long lockdown of pandemic has made me more grateful than ever for the privilege of travel and the opportunity to celebrate family milestones. One week of this vacation will be devoted to camping and hiking and exploring Acadia National Park. I will be out of range of

cell towers and Zoom for most of it – total bliss! A second week will take us to Kentucky to celebrate 60 years of marriage for Jim's parents. The actual anniversary occurred earlier this year, when we were all still in Covid lockdown. We are looking forward to seeing extended family for the first time in more than a year and a half. I hope that all of you will find some opportunities for recreation and renewal this summer, whether it is at a national park or with family in another state or in your own backyards.

I plan to thoroughly enjoy my vacation, but I am also looking forward to what comes next, to the ways that we are shaping our communal life as we emerge from the strain and hardships of the past year. We endured together, and as a result, we are changed, probably in ways that we do not yet know. I am confident that God is at work for good among us.

Last month, many of you participated in the survey conducted by the Pastoral Relations Committee. Twenty-five individuals responded along with a group response from the Wednesday Bible study. Your answers suggest that you also have confidence in God's good work among us. You celebrated the resilience we demonstrated over the last year, our ability to learn new technology and our attempts to stay connected with those who lacked that ability. You extended grace to those in leadership, including me. We worked hard, but not perfectly. It was also our first time to experience a worldwide pandemic and you recognized that everyone did the best they could.

In response to the question about priorities for the future, most of you had an outward focus. You mentioned reaching those who are not part of the congregation, combating racism and gun violence, protecting the queer community, and building on what we have learned about being church in digital space. You want to continue nurturing children and youth. You also wonder about sustaining our presence at 275 State Street. You want to provide opportunities for adults to engage in spiritual and theological formation, but many of you are open to doing that at times other than right after worship on Sundays.

These responses are hopeful. The difficulties of the last 18 months have not diminished your capacity for compassion, your hunger for justice. You are choosing flexibility and openness to change rather than a rigid return to our pre-Covid patterns. I am always proud to be your pastor and your attitudes in times like these only amplify that feeling.



The Immigration Task Force of the FOCUS Churches will reconvene in September 2021. FOCUS Churches has identified the complex issue of immigration as one of four priorities to which we may respond with advocacy, collective participation by our covenant churches and affiliates, linking with community partners, and providing direct service. The good momentum we had built up in this

important area came to a sudden halt when the pandemic broke out in March 2020, but we are preparing to take it up again this fall. We will begin with re-assessing the contributions and needs of immigrants in our community, the services currently available, and the effects of changes in immigration policies within the last year. Four EBCers are already involved – Mary Asala, Nancy Horan, Becky Klope, and Kathy Moore. We are looking for a few more friends within the FOCUS Community to join this work. The FOCUS Board voted at its June meeting to become co-sponsors of the State Street Forum on Faith and Public Life, a monthly noontime conversation that began as a partnership between the Westminster Presbyterian Church and the New York State Council of Churches. Our goal for the Forum is to engage people

of faith in the work of connecting our faith with issues of public concern so that we can more fully participate in public conversations and become effective advocates for policies that align with our values.

The Forum launched in May with a conversation on Zoom called "Beyond Food Drives" that focused on long-term remedies to food insecurity in New York State. FOCUS Executive Director Fred Boehrer was one of the speakers. In June, a conversation on immigration included a "faith response" from Rev. Kathy Donley from Emmanuel Baptist Church, a FOCUS congregation. Recordings of both conversations are available on Westminster's YouTube page.
